

GRADUATE PROGRAM AUDITING POLICY

SJD students are authorized to audit one course per term; LLM thesis students may apply to audit on an exceptional basis. In order to so, students are required to fill out a form, indicating the reasons why they want to audit that course and how it is connected to their research. The request needs to be approved by the student's supervisor and the Associate Dean.

Students should be aware that approval in principle does not guarantee access to any particular course; auditing is conditional upon permission from the instructor and availability of space in the class (which will not be confirmed until the end of the add/drop period).

Requests to audit upper year lecture courses as well as upper-year seminars taught by full-time faculty are most likely to be approved. Only in rare occasions students will be authorized to audit courses taught by adjunct professors. Requests to audit first year courses are only granted on an exceptional basis; experiential and clinical courses are not open to auditing.
