
Study Space at Victoria University

There are 3 Libraries within the Victoria University Quadrangle, all of which offer study space.

Law Library Reading Room:

Location: Birge Carnegie Building, 95 Charles Street West, First Floor



The new Law Library Reading room on the first floor of the Birge Carnegie Building has approximately 60 seats at study tables. It also has wireless internet access and many plug outlets. This is a **quiet** reading room. You can <u>print your essays</u> in the copy room next door, including via wireless printing (coming very soon).

❖ Vic's Pratt Library (includes group study rooms):

<u>Location</u>: Pratt Library is located in the Victoria University Quadrangle, across from Victoria College and next to Northrop Frye Hall

The Pratt Library has <u>4 group study rooms</u>, one of which is bookable at the Pratt Library's circulation desk (or at 416-585-4470) for groups of 5 students or more for periods of up to 2 hours. The other 3 group study rooms are usable on a first-come first-served basis.

The Pratt Library also offers:

- a large reading room with study tables
- a special Collections Reading Room that can be used by all students for studying
- a seminar room on the 3rd floor which, if not hosting a class, can be used as a group study room
- a beautiful student lounge on the lower level that includes leather couches and chairs for studying
- individual study carrels
- 2 computer areas

Emmanuel College Library:

<u>Location</u>: Top floor of Emmanuel College, attached to the Birge Carnegie building. You can access the Emmanuel library before approximately 5pm via the 2nd floor of Birge Carnegie; alternatively, you can exit Birge to enter Emmanuel via: the back entrance on the Vic Quad, the front entrance on Queen's Park, or the side entrance closest to Northrop Frye.

Emmanuel College Library offers tables for studying, as well as 6 computer stations.

Goldring Student Centre:

Location: 150 Charles Street (North Side)

Goldring Student Centre has numerous lounge areas on the first floor for students that can be used for studying, as well as a group study room (usable on a first-come first-served basis) on the top floor.
