Eligibility:

Law Society/Law Foundation Scholarships:

Applicant must be ordinarily resident in Prince Edward Island; enrolled as a full time law student at an accredited University Law School for the 2015-16 academic year; have demonstrated financial need; and have demonstrated scholastic achievement in the previous year of study.

Daphne Dumont Scholarship:

Applicant must be a member of the CBA as of July 31, 2015; ordinarily resident in Prince Edward Island; enrolled as a full time law student at an accredited University Law School for the 2015-2016 academic year; have demonstrated scholastic achievement in the previous year of study; and have demonstrated commitment to and be an active volunteer in his or her community.

Application:

Applicant must submit the following documentation for consideration for either or both of the Law Society/Law Foundation and CBA Daphne Dumont scholarships:

- (1) Completed Application Form;
- (2) Official written confirmation of enrolment in an accredited law school from the Admissions Office or the Office of the Registrar of the accredited law school;
- (3) Official transcript of marks for the previous year of study;
- (4) Curriculum vitae; and
- (5) Proof of CBA membership as of July 31, 2015 (if applicable)

Method of Selection:

A committee selected by the Council of the Law Society of Prince Edward Island shall determine the recipients of the scholarships each year.

ADMISSIONS

11. A person applying to be enrolled and registered as an articulated clerk shall:
- (a) be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada;
 - (b) except for a person serving articles or clerkship pursuant to the requirements of subsection 18(1),
 - (i) have received a law degree in common law from a Canadian law school, as approved by the Federation of Law Societies of Canada;
 - (ii) have successfully completed the following courses in obtaining such Degree:
 - Canadian Constitutional Law
 - Civil Procedure
 - Contracts
 - Criminal Law
 - Property Law
 - Torts
 - Ethics/Professional Responsibility
 - (iii) and have successfully completed 4 of 7 courses in the following subject areas in obtaining such Degree:
 - Criminal Procedure
 - Commercial Law
 - Corporate Law
 - Evidence
 - Family Law
 - Wills/Trusts
 - Administrative Law;
