To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must submit a completed application and the following additional documents:

- Confirmation of enrollment in in a common law program offered by a University in Canada approved by the Law Society of Upper Canada.
- A cover letter addressing how you meet the eligibility requirements of the scholarship.
- A resume or curriculum vitae.
- Most recent academic transcript.
