

Call for Submissions

The Windsor Review of Legal and Social Issues ("Windsor Review") is now inviting contributions for Volume 41, to be published in Summer 2020.

About Us

The Windsor Review is an entirely student-run and double-blind peer-reviewed interdisciplinary law journal, under the guidance of faculty advisor Dr. Claire Mummé.

Since our inaugural publication in 1989, the Windsor Review has been dedicated to utilizing law as a vehicle for social change. Our mandate is to promote an analytical, practical, and empirical approach to the study of law, incorporating the perspectives of multiple disciplines. As a non-traditional journal, the Windsor Review offers a distinct advantage to students, lawyers, and legal scholars who seek a high-quality, rigorous review process paired with timely publication.

We are currently soliciting original articles, book reviews, and comments on recent cases or legislation. Submissions should conform to the Canadian Guide to Uniform Legal Citation (9th Edition). As a resource for academics, professionals, adjudicators, and public policy makers, copies of the journal can be found in libraries worldwide and through various legal and scholarly electronic databases such as Westlaw, HeinOnline, and Quicklaw/LexisNexis.

Submissions Deadlines

The Windsor Review has an open call for submissions until October 1, 2019.

Final publication decisions are typically made by the student-run Editorial Committee in January, once peer reviewers' comments are received. Volume 41 will be sent to the printer in Spring 2020. The Windsor Review, therefore, typically publishes articles within the same year of submission. Submissions received after the deadline will continue to be reviewed by the Editorial Committee on a rolling basis.
